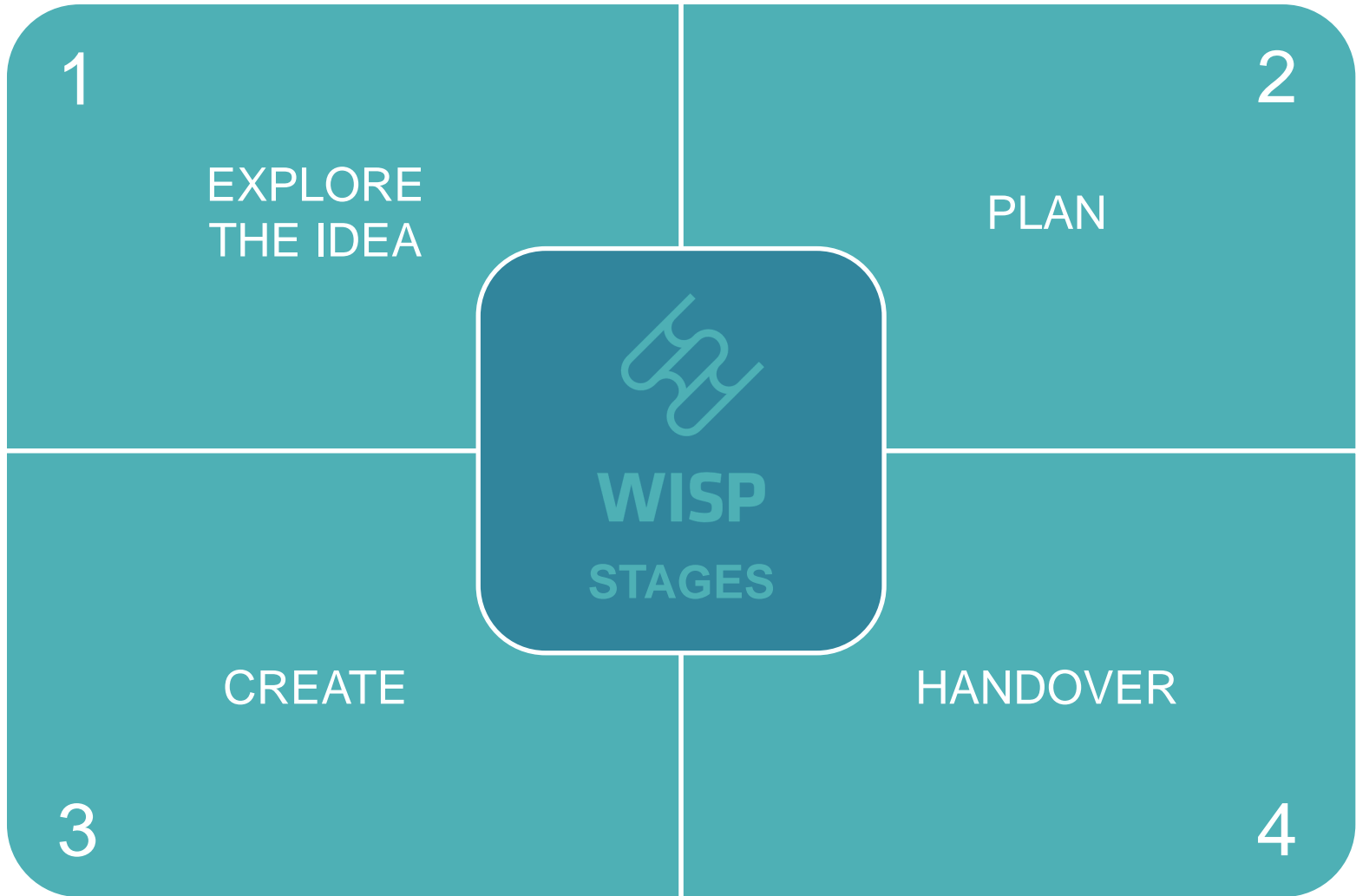
Background

- There is no shortage of frameworks available for managing projects.
- Recognized frameworks/methodologies are designed to address the needs of projects of varying scope, sizes, budgets, industry, complexity, etc.
- This can make them too detailed and/or complex for managing small and/or non-complex projects.
- The approaches take a long time to learn, and even longer to master; they are typically created for full-time project managers.
- Huge numbers of individuals, whilst not being recognized as project professionals, work on projects, or manage projects as part of their BAU role.
- Small and non-complex projects (and 'part-time' project managers) require a framework that's fit for purpose; one that's easy to understand and simple to apply.

PRINCIPLES

- 1 Provide a good project justification.
- 2 Organise the project team.
- 3 Do what you agreed to do.
- 4 Avoid unnecessary risks.
- 5 Keep the plan up to date.
- 6 Take change into account.
- 7 Regularly monitor progress.

- Individuals for whom project management is a part-time or occasional activity;
- Project professionals that often work on small and/or non-complex projects;
- Students and graduates requiring an entry-level project management framework and understanding;
- Small and medium enterprises, where existing project management frameworks may be deemed unnecessarily complex and unsuited to their typical projects.
