




Background

- Agile project management is increasingly how business gets done. Ever-increasing numbers of organizations are embracing Agile approaches to react faster to the ever-changing world around them and delivery change more effectively.
- Two of the world's leading Agile frameworks are AgilePM (for project management) and Scrum (for product development).
- Scrum covers product development very well but that is only part of the story in a broader business context. Many organizations, particularly larger corporates and public sector bodies, organize their work as projects.
- Agile product delivery can achieve only a fraction of its full potential when constrained by traditional project thinking. Trying to use Scrum in an environment optimized for a traditional approach is highly unlikely to work well unless there is significant effort put into changing the roles, responsibilities, customs, practices and, more important still, the mindset associated with the defined approach.




Product Development vs Project Management

- Where product development primarily focuses on the what and the how of the way the product evolves to achieve its purpose, project management focuses on the coordination and governance associated with the environment in which product development happens.
- Project Management deals with matters such as:
 - Who is involved in all aspects of the project, their recruitment, education and ongoing engagement in the process
 of realizing value in the outcome. A project construct is particularly valuable where individuals are organized into
 multiple interdependent teams or have a part-time, specialist role to play.
 - Why the work should be undertaken, the purpose and value of the endeavor and the justification and/or business case for it, both at the outset and throughout the lifetime of the project. The focus on a business case (formal or otherwise) and realizing value, rather than just enabling it, is a key focus of AgilePM.
 - When the work should occur, considering time-based drivers for key events, deliveries and stakeholder engagement, and dealing with priorities and dependencies of elements of the work, both internal and external to the project.
 - Where including all matters related to the working environment from geography to infrastructure, from buildings, desks and chairs to the tools needed to collaborate and get the job done.


Scrum overview

- The world's most popular framework for developing, delivering and sustaining complex products through effective team collaboration. Used in the development of countless thousands of software products.
- Created by Ken Schwaber and Jeff Sutherland; originally launched in 1995.
- Scrum is not a process, technique or definitive method. Rather, it is a framework within which various processes and techniques can be employed.
- Framework consists of Scrum Teams and associated roles, events, Artefacts and rules.
- The rules of Scrum bind together the roles, events and artefacts, governing the relationships and interaction between them.
- The rules are described in The Scrum Guide (available in over 30 languages).
- The essence of Scrum is a small team of people. The individual team is highly flexible and adaptive.
- At the heart of Scrum is the concept of Empirical Process Control a way of working that leverages the principles of transparency, inspection, and adaption.
- Often described as LIGHTWEIGHT, SIMPLE TO UNDERSTAND, DIFFICULT TO MASTER




What is AgilePM for Scrum?

- Presents a strong customization of AgilePM (for agile project management) designed to integrate seamlessly with Scrum (for agile product development) in a single framework.
- Intended to bring together the powerful simplicity and potent agility of Scrum for product development, exactly as described in the Scrum Guide 2020, with key elements of AgilePM that bring agility to the much broader project context.
- Introduces a framework that deals with the coordination of multiple development teams in the context of a single outcome or product.
- Differs from, and adds value to, the Scrum approach by offering a truly agile project context for product development focused on realizing value rather than just delivering latent value in products.
- That project context provides a focus for the entire business solution rather than just the product.
- Equally applicable to IT/software- and non-IT/software-centric projects and environments.


AgilePM for Scrum

The guidance is designed to address the following problems:

- Agile product development in an Agile project environment
- Scrum covers product development very well but that is only part of the story in a broader business context.
- Many organizations, particularly larger corporates and public sector bodies, organize their work as projects.
- Agile product delivery can achieve only a fraction of its full potential when constrained by traditional project thinking.
- AgilePM provides project agility up to 'corporate strength' where required to enable business agility.
- The antidote to VUCA (Volatility, Uncertainty, Complexity and Ambiguity) inherent in the operating environment of any organization.
- Trying to use Scrum in an environment optimized for a traditional approach is highly unlikely to work well unless there is significant effort put into changing the roles, responsibilities, customs, practices and, more important still, the mindset associated with the defined approach.








AgilePM for Scrum

In combination with Scrum, AgilePM provides an agile project framework to support Scrum product development including:

- A project lifecycle process with appropriate governance (e.g. financial, regulatory etc.)
- Provides the Product Owner with a business and corporate frame of reference within which to direct product development and ensure an ongoing focus on the over-arching business need
- Provides the Scrum Master with a forum to influence business and project management 'authorities' to help optimize Scrum performance at the Scrum Team level
- Provides the organization with a frame of reference for development that they understand and through which they can influence the evolution of the product
- Provides a forum for identifying and directing all non-product-related work such as business change activities

AgilePM for Scrum: scenario 1

In an IT-enabled business change project the solution is likely to involve:


- Software Product Increments from one or more Scrum software development teams (perhaps demarked by the specific technologies employed)
- Commissioning of IT hardware required for the software to run on, networking deliverables connecting the hardware together, the licenses needed etc.
- Business process descriptions to the required level of formality, operating instructions for the system in the context of those processes.
- All plans and agreements associated with the organization, deployment and revised working practices of individuals and teams that operate the business.
- Training materials for training impacted staff along with a resourced schedule for their training, documentation required for regulatory approval if needed.

Scrum deals with the first bullet.

AgilePM[®] should be used to coordinate that with the rest of the list.







AgilePM for Scrum: scenario 2

For a physical product being introduced into a competitive marketplace the solution is likely to involve:

- Designing and building the product itself possibly delivered by one or more teams if the product is complex, e.g. individual components of the product, its packaging, etc.
- Setting up a production line for the mass-production of the product along with the supply chain for raw materials and components
- Various collateral for the marketing and sale of the product
- Any legal/compliance documentation required before the product can be sold
- Commercial agreements with retailers of the product

Again, Scrum deals with the first bullet.

AgilePM[®] coordinates that with the rest of the list.

AgilePM for Scrum: who is it for?

- Whether you are a Scrum advocate looking for a way to help Scrum fit into the corporate project environment or an AgilePM advocate looking to harness the large population of Scrum professionals in a corporate-friendly agile Project Management framework – a combination of the two should prove valuable.
 - Organizations aiming to increase their agility in the face of VUCA (Volatile, Uncertain, Complex and Ambiguous) conditions in their operating/market environment. The two key target groups are:
 - Scrum advocates looking for a way to help Scrum fit into the corporate project environment
 - AgilePM advocates looking to harness the large population of Scrum professionals in a corporatefriendly agile Project Management framework.
- There are over 12 million developers currently using Scrum globally. Many teams using Scrum have learnt the hard way that there are gaps in the effective use of Scrum when multiple teams are involved. AgilePM for Scrum addresses questions about these gaps directly.
- Many organizations have designed bespoke project management strategies that attempt to accommodate Scrum practices. In many cases, these will not have been designed with agility in mind and will be constraining the potential for optimum business agility.
- Overall approach can be tailored to meet individual needs and different organizational requirements.
- Designed for business looking to increase the agility of their projects in the face of VUCA market and business conditions.
